Roughly speaking I'd say you need around 3" x 3" of paper to get the crane to fit in that box. This is going to depend a bit on how you fold it, what angles the neck and tail are at, if the wings are folded up or down, etc. Try with a 3" x 3" square of paper and see if that works and then adjust up or down if you need.

If you have an ordinary piece of printer paper, just fold one of the top corners across the paper until it aligns with the bottom edge of the sheet, leaving a long strip of rectangular paper. Cut the strip to make the paper square. 2 Fold the paper in half into a rectangle.
